The Red Republican was a British socialist newspaper published from 22 June 1850 to 30 November 1850, after which it was renamed The Friend of the People.Â The Red Republican published the first English translation of the Communist Manifesto in 1850, but was not a financial success and closed down in December of the same year.[citation needed]. Subsequently, Harney published the Friend of the People (December 1850 - April 1852), Star of Freedom (April 1852 - December 1852) and The Vanguard (January 1853 - March 1853). Radical Republicans. A Minority Political Party, eventually won over most of the Moderates during Reconstruction. Wanted harsher penalties/requirements for the South. Believed that they needed to step in and enact state laws to protect the former slaves civil rights. Passed the Civil Rights Act of 1866, the First Reconstruction Act, the Second Reconstruction Act, the Ku Klux Klan Act of 1871, the Civil Rights Act of 1875, and the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, and Fifteenth Amendments. Members of this party in the H.O.R. also impeached President Andrew Johnson in 1868 but were unable to secure enough votes.
