This book describes his experiences as a lieutenant in the Korean War and the different warfare technologies used by the U.S. Army over time. The Consequences of Modernity. By President James R. Guerrilla Warfare (Spanish: La Guerra de Guerrillas) is a military handbook written by Marxist revolutionary Che Guevara. Published in 1961 following the Cuban Revolution, it became a reference for thousands of guerrilla fighters in various countries around the world. The book draws upon Guevara's personal experience as a guerrilla soldier during the Cuban Revolution, generalizing for readers who would undertake guerrilla warfare in their own countries. Afghan Guerrilla Warfare is a study of operations and actions of the Afghan Mujahideen resistance fighting against the Soviet forces in Afghanistan 1979-89. It is told in the words of the Mujahideen themselves and provides a dramatic and graphic document of what Coalition forces can expect if they become embroiled in a land war in Afghanistan. This is an excellent piece of reference material for anyone interested in Guerilla warfare and insurgency. The book is laid out in a very logical manner where by each chapter looks at a specific tactic such as Chapter 1: Ambushes, Chapter 2: Raids, Chapter 14: Urban Combat and so on. At the start of each chapter is an outline of the tactic by the author and in what purpose it served to the Afghan Mujahideen.
