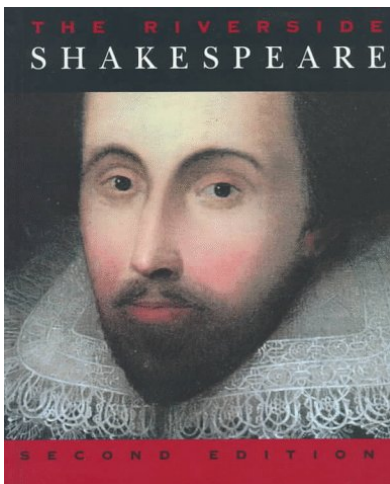

The first Riverside Shakespeare was edited by Richard Grant White and published in 1883 and 1901.
