According to Part 4 of Article 15 of the Constitution of the Russian Federation, the generally recognised principles and rules of international law and international treaties of the Russian Federation constitute an integral part of its legal system. Freedom of the media on the territory of the Russian Federation is covered by Article 10 of the Convention for the Protection of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms, in accordance with Part 1 of which every person has the right to express his opinion freely. This right includes the freedom to support one's opinion, receive and distribute information. On 7 March 2001, the Knesset adopted a new version of the Basic Law on Government, by a vote of 72 to 37 and three abstentions. The new law phases out direct election of the Prime Minister and restores the system that Israel had used until the 1996 elections, i.e. voters cast a ballot for one party and the Knesset seats are distributed proportionally. The Committee for Sustainable Development held its main annual session from 12 to 14 March 2001 at IPU Headquarters in Geneva. Created in 1995, the Committee elected Mr. Paul Ginter (Switzerland) as President. Among other items, the Committee discussed food security and the right to food.
